Minister Launches Media Industry Sexual Harassment Policy



In a significant step towards ensuring a safe and inclusive working environment within Zimbabwe's media industry, the Minister of Information, Publicity and Broadcasting Services, Dr. Jenfan Muswere, officially launched the Media Industry Sexual Harassment Policy earlier this month.

The policy, developed by the Zimbabwe Media Commission (ZMC), aims to combat sexual harassment and foster a culture of respect and equality within the media sector.

The launch event was attended by prominent figures from the media industry, including journalists, media executives, representatives from media organizations, and members of civil society.

The occasion marked a crucial milestone in the ongoing efforts to address workplace harassment and discrimination.

Kariba's right hand continues to sanctify its local needy

It is confirmed that there are an estimated 258 million widows around the globe, and nearly one in ten live in extreme poverty. As women, they have specific needs, but their voices and experiences are often absent from policies that impact their survival. Supporting widows and pregnant is a compassionate and impactful way to make a difference. The community of Kariba identified Mai Muhoni from local board Mahombekombe, Kariba who is a mother of two boys, having had lost her husband on 14th of February 2024 and was left with pregnancy that has twin girls confirmed by a scan done by sister Tembo of Kariba hospital. The loss of a partner is devastating. For many women, that loss is magnified by a long- term struggle for basic needs, their human rights and dignity. They may be denied inheritance rights to the piece of land that they relied on for livelihood or evicted from their homes, forced into unwanted marriages or traumatizing widowhood rituals. They are stigmatized for life, shunned and shamed. And many of these abuses go unnoticed, even normalized

However, for Kariba, it is a different story as Mai Muhoni who was struggling with severe depression after losing her partner, overwhelmed at the prospect of providing for herself and her children on her own got the Kariba's right hand of blessing by giving coming through into her life. Residents in Kariba picked up her unfortunate condition during the Kasambabezi Community Radio show called 'Family Matters' hosted by Auntie Cee and the results were just marvelous as resources were quickly mobilized for her. Special mention would go to sister Tembo, Auntie Cee, Mr Sithole, Mai Tafadzwa, Mai Chikukwa, Mai Madzamba, Mai Tafadzwa, Mai Kafere, Mai Ruzvidzo and Mai Mubaira for leading the processes of providing clothes. food and recommendation has been that the program move on to register for charity work, but the Station head Mr. John Chirinda said that community radios are a driver to enable and expedite development through other organisations who already are working on such programs. He called upon such like-minded organisations to grab the opportunities that radio has brought and change people's lives.

Chirinda went on to say that, "Women and girl child empowerment and development should be at the centre of programming as it shapes the current life and future regards cultural stigmatization eradication and liberty from bondage." At Kasambabezi FM, the Thursday evening program 'Family Matters' has created a network of families and especially women to support each other emotionally and now socially as well as economically. Mai Muhoni appreciated the support by the community through KFM by saying; "Not only has the assistance by KFM enabled me to provide for my children and the unborn twins, it has become my sanctuary. Surrounded by love from women of my age who might also have overcame similar situations, we became each other's support system and friends," she went further to say "I hope that my children find inspiration in this hand of love, care and giving, seeing how far I have come as a woman, despite the circumstances."
